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#### TRUSTEES' REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2009

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 September 2009.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the church's trust deed, the Charities Act 1993 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

The church was established by a charitable trust deed on 30 July 1885.

Trusteees (also known as deacons) are appointed by church members by a vote at a church members' meeting.

The members of the church appoint Elders, who may be employed, to oversee the spiritual well-being of the church, and Deacons to oversee practical and administrative matters. The deacons also act as the trustees of the church.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the church is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### Objectives and activities

The church's objects are to glorify God, through the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the inhabitants of Poplar, and the building up of those who are believers so that they grow to maturity in their understanding of, and obedience to, the Word of God. The church also supports missionaries working overseas and gives assistance to those who are in financial hardship. The policies adopted in furtherance of these objects are to preach the Word of God, to pray, and to encourage believers to build each other up, and there has been no change in these during the year.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the church should undertake.

During the year the church held services of worship on Sundays, prayer meetings on Mondays, Bible studies or home groups on Wednesdays, women's meetings on Tuesdays, children's meetings on Thursdays, and visitation and counselling sessions at various times.

# Achievements and performance

During the year an average of 45 people attended services each week on Sunday mornings and 25 on Sunday afternoons. A number of people professed faith in Christ during this period, and existing believers were strengthened in their faith. About 20 children came to the children's classes each week, and about 8 women to the women's meetings. About 25 people were involved in home groups.

#### **Financial review**

During the year total income was £44,867, of which £7,170 were restricted funds. Total expenditure was £49,041 of which £3,710 was from restricted funds. The total fund balance therefore reduced from £9,658 at the start of the year to £5,484 at the end of the year; this comprised £3,400 restricted funds and £2,084 unrestricted funds.

The trustees are satisfied with the level of reserves and are confident that future expenditure can be met from future income.

#### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

#### TO THE TRUSTEES OF POPLAR BAPTIST CHURCH

I report on the accounts of the church for the year ended 30 September 2009, which are set out on pages 4 to 8.
